RESOLUTION NO. 1134-2023, APPROPRIATING \$21,499,709 IN OPIOID SETTLEMENT FUNDING AS RECOMMENDED BY THE OPIOID SETTLEMENT FUNDING SELECTION COMMITTEE

WHEREAS, the County of Suffolk served as a national leader by commencing litigation to hold pharmaceutical manufacturers, distributors and pharmacy operators responsible for their various roles in the creation and perpetuation of the opioid addiction epidemic; and

WHEREAS, Suffolk County Resolution 609-2022 established the Opioid Settlement Funding Selection Committee (the "Committee") to manage the important task of allocating opioid litigation settlement funding received by the County of Suffolk; and

WHEREAS, the Opioid Settlement Funding Selection Committee has reviewed applications and now recommends the allocation of \$21,499,709 million in funding be awarded for prevention, harm reduction, opioid treatment, and recovery services and for capital improvements to facilities associated with opioid use disorder; and

WHEREAS, the 2023 Adopted Operating Budget includes a \$48,360,937 million unallocated fund balance, \$6,225,000 was appropriated via Resolution No. 15-2023; and

WHEREAS, \$21,499,709 of the remaining fund balance has been awarded by the Committee; and

WHEREAS, the County Legislature Adopted Resolution Nos. 961-2021 and 962-2021 which restricted the use of these monies; and

WHEREAS, to ensure compliance with these legislative resolutions and its directives, a new unit code was created to track the expenses associated with the awards; and

WHEREAS, it is the intent of the Legislature to allow these appropriations to roll over into the following year pursuant to the terms of the respective contracts and in compliance with the awards pursuant to Resolution Nos. 961-2021 and 962-2021 which restricted the use of these monies; now, therefore be it

- 1st **RESOLVED**, that the Suffolk County Legislature hereby approves the appropriation of funding in the total amount of \$21,499,709, subject to any additional SEQRA review as may be required for each project; and be it further
- **2nd RESOLVED**, that the County Comptroller be and hereby is authorized to appropriate \$21,499,709 from the Fund Balance within the Opioid Abatement, Recovery and Support Fund, to the contract agencies listed below as follows:

Environmental Conservation Law Article 8 and Chapter 450 of the Suffolk County Code, hereby finds and determines that this resolution constitutes a Type II action pursuant to Section 617.5 (26) and (33) of Title 6 of the NEW YORK CODE OF RULES AND REGULATIONS ("NYCRR") in that the action constitutes routine or continuing agency administration and management, not including new programs or major reordering of priorities that may affect the environment, and adoption of regulations, policies, procedures and local legislative decisions in connection with any action on this list. The Suffolk County Council on Environmental Quality (CEQ) is hereby directed to circulate any appropriate SEQRA notices of determination of non-applicability or non-significance in accordance with this resolution.
